Peter K. Kilpatrick and Josef A. Nossek has been awarded the honorary doctorate of Pázmány Péter Catholic University.

Peter Kilpatrick serves as the McCloskey Dean of Engineering at the University of Notre Dame, USA. Kilpatrick conducts research in colloidal and interfacial science, with an emphasis on the colloidal and molecular properties of crude oil and on biological membranes. He is one of the most dominant representatives of the catholic univiersity ideal, especially in the United States.



Josef Nossek is Professor at the Technical University in Munich and has served previously as Dean of the Faculty of Electrical Engineering and Information Technology.
